



Unlock Walk 2013 Quiz Locations and Answers

Note: Some of this year's quiz questions focus attention on the different sorts of housing in Eltham.

1

Location. Sherard Road.

Question. In not more than four words each, describe the three sorts of housing you see along Sherard Road.

Answer. **Bay-windowed semis; pebble-dashed council; large blocks of flats.**

Note: *This, for example, would also be acceptable: **Semi-detached, Old tower blocks, Newer low-rise flats.** The principle is to have looked intelligently at the housing.*

L. North side of Sherard Road, on the bend.

Q. What is offered at 81 Tattersal Close?

A. **Day Services.**

L. Junction of Court Yard and King John's Walk. East side.

Q. How far is it between the Thames Barrier and Crystal Palace via the Green Chain Walk?

A. **16 miles**

L. King John's Walk. On the skyline to the NW.

Q. Name the tallest building on the skyline (we passed it on the 2011 Walk).

A. **The Shard.** *No other answer acceptable e.g. Crystal Palace, Canary Wharf, etc.*

L. King John's Walk. West side. About half way, a bit south, towards the bend.

Q. What was the nickname of the mother of Prince John of Eltham?

A. **"The Fair".**

L. Middle Park Avenue. East side. Between Children's Centre and Newmarket Green.

Q. How do people living in this Council-type housing get to their back doors?

A. **Through an arched tunnel.** *Any acceptable equivalent form of words.*

L. Middle Park Avenue. West side, half way along straight bit.

Q. Where is the home of Cray Valley (PM) FC?

A. **Badgers Sport & Social Club.**

L. Near Yorkshire Grey Roundabout. E side of N end of Middle Park Avenue.

Q. What special areas of study are offered by Harris Academy?

A. **Sport, Enterprise & Communication.**

9

L. Haimo Road. North side.

Q. To what is Haimo Primary School committed?

A. **Keeping Children Safe.**

10 (inset map)

L. Meadowside. Triangular “Concierge” pillar (and at other locations).

Q. What is Berkeley’s strap-line?

A. **“Designed for life.”**

11

L. Junction of Purneys Road and Briset Road. In the V where the two roads merge.

Q. What day does the mobile library stop?

A. **Thursday.**

L. Kingsholm Gardens. On the “island” in the middle.

Q. What’s different about the roofs of Nos. 37-51 Kingsholm Gardens?

A. **Single pitched** (look flat from the ends, but they’re not!)

Note: *This one is hard to express in words. “**Sloping inwards**” would be acceptable. “**No chimneys**” would be worth half a mark.*

L. Junction Well Hall Road/Downman Road. Just south of Catholic church.

Q. How many “gnomes” look after the animals?

A. **8 or 5. There are 8 altogether in the garden but 5 are close to the animals.**

14a

L. Westmount Road, north-east corner of Elibank Road.

Q. What specialist area is dealt with by this clinic?

A. **Back Pain.**

14b

L. Westmount Road, north-east corner of Earlshall Road.

Q. What’s in the backyard of Jimmy’s Plaice?

A. **A communications mast.**

14c

L. Westmount Road/Railway Line. East side.

Q. Eltham Park Station closed in 1985. Where is the booking office building still?

A. **On the bridge. “Station Parade” is worth half a mark.**

14d

L. Westmount Road, north-east corner of Glenshiel Road.

Q. What specialist area is dealt with by this surgery?

A. **Yellow Fever.**

15

L. Gourock Road, north side, towards the west end.

Q. How might we be Close to the birthplace of John Bunyan?

A. **We’re at Elstow Close.**

16

L. Strongbow Crescent Towerblock Flats. Between the tower blocks.

Q. Name three things one is asked not to do at or near these flats.

A. **3 of these six: Dumping rubbish, Playing ball games, Dog fouling/Dogs, Making noise, Smoking, Non-resident Parking/Parking without permit.**

17

L. Footbridge over the A2.

Q. About how many vehicles pass under this bridge in one minute?

A. **Answers should be within the range of 60 to 140.**

Note: Traffic in both directions needed to be counted.

Quizmaster has never recorded fewer than 50 on several visits at different times. Traffic was particularly heavy on Walk Day, and 122 was recorded at 1.40 pm.

18 (inset map)

L. Entry gates (1 and 3) to the Pleasaunce.

Q. Who suggested the name "Pleasaunce"?

A. **A local Headteacher.**

19 (inset map)

L. Tudor Barn. William Barefoot memorial, to the north of the barn.

Q. Complete the following: Turn your face to the sun.....

A. **.....and the shadows will fall behind you.**

20 (inset map)

L. Plaque in the Pleasaunce. West side of path, just north of "Gate 2".

Q. Name another book written by the author of "The Railway Children".

A. **e.g. The Phoenix and the Carpet, Five children and It, The Wouldbegoods, The Treasure Seekers.**
