L. Café opposite Whalebone Lane.  
Q. Where can you get Chicken Ribs & Pizza?  
A. Mummy Yum/Burj

L. The Grove, outside Morrisons.

L. Homerton High Street, south side, at crossing.

A. Lots of possibilities such as Friendship, Giving, Helping, Joy, Caring, Sharing.

L. Unlock Base Church.

L. Felstead Street, south side, towards east end.
