Location. Midway along Bryant Street north side, opposite Methodist Church.
Question. What area of London did Queen Mary's Hospital serve?
Answer. The East End.

L. Police Station Notice Board.
Q. On which two days do Stratford Police apparently hope there is no crime?
A. Sunday and Monday.

L. Café opposite Whalebone Lane.
Q. Where can you get Chicken Ribs & Pizza?
A. Mummy Yum

L. The Grove, outside Morrisons.
Q. How many figures support the globe? How many globes on the ground?
A. 3; 6.

L. The Grove, west side, north of Broadway corner.
Q. This restaurant has a magnificent tiled oven in the window and connections with Iraq.
A. Babylon.

L. Grove Crescent, north side, near The Grove.
Q. Who owns this very public convenience?
A. Jewson – Priority Plumbing (*accept either or both*)

7

L. Between Crownfield Road and Honour Lea Avenue.
Q. How does Newham's name for this road differ between E15 and E20?
A. Temple Mill(s) Lane.

8

L. Along the canal.
Q. Give the names of two houseboats you see moored along the canal.
A. *See Appendix 8 below.*

L. Millfields Road, north side.
Q. According to Hackney Homes Heritage, what was Millfields Road Stadium home to?
A. Clapton Orient Football Club.

L. Millfields Road junction with Glyn Road, south-east corner.
Q. After which famous Labour politician is this estate named?
A. Nye Bevan.

11

L. Chatsworth Road, west side, between Rushmore and Blurton Roads.

Q. When should you not recycle rubbish here?
A. Between 9.00 pm and 9.00 am.

L. Chatsworth Road, east side, between Rushmore and Blurton Roads.

Q. Fish from around the world, but especially from.....?

A. Caribbean and Africa.

L. Powercroft Road, north side, near Round Chapel.

Q. Why might you think from No. 17 that these houses were almshouses (they are not)?

A. Plaque "Citizen Dwellings".

L. Lower Clapton Road, west side, opposite Round Chapel.

Q. It's now "Caribbean Cuisine" but which scientist and clergyman lived here in the 1790s?

A. Joseph Priestley.

L. Lower Clapton Road, west side, at junction with Urswick Road.

Q. Can you spell the name of this Turkish Bakery?

A. GÜLLÜOĞLU. (*Double dots above the first two "U"s required.*)

L. Urswick Road, at bend, south-west side.

Q. Between what times is this National Trust property open today?

A. 12.00 – 17.00

L. Homerton High Street, south side, at crossing.

Q. Name two positive qualities mentioned on the top of this wishing well.

A. Lots of possibilities such as Friendship, Giving, Helping, Joy, Caring, Sharing.

L. Unlock Base Church.

Q. Where do the people running the Unlock workshop usually do their Unlock work?

A. Sunderland and Hull.

L. Felstead Street, south side, towards east end.

Q. Who will repair your bike?

A. Skinny Eric.

L. Berkshire Road, east side, opposite Felstead Street.

Q. What did Alexander Parkes do near here in 1866?

A. Made the first plastic in the world.

Stratford Bonus Question

L. (a) The Grove, east side, almost opposite to but slightly north of Grove Crescent
(b) St Paul's Church.

Q. Where might you find a church service (a) in Romanian? (b) in Bulgarian?

A. (a) Central Baptist (*See Appendix S below*) (b) St Paul's.

L. Homerton High Street (south side) / Homerton Road (Wally Foster Centre).

- Q. At least 9 African or Pentecostal church groups meet in premises along the Homerton stretch of the walk. See how many you can spot and give the names of two of them.
